



International Job Broker Conference

Outcome in terms of successful and sustainable placements becomes increasingly important as performance indicator for measures of active labour market policy (ALMP) across Europe resulting in outcome orientated contracting of providers of ALMP measures.

These new challenge forces providers to rethink their services as well as traditional job roles of Job Agents (ArbeitsvermittlerInnen) and Counsellors (BeraterInnen). In this situation a new occupational role emerged. Under the headline "Job Broker" we will look at this new role and understanding of Job Brokering service and define a job profile, that merges the traditional roles of Job Agents and Counsellors.

In this conference Richard Parkes will illuminate transitions in labour market policy that led to emergence of this new occupational profile. Soffia Gisladdottir from Iceland and Vaso Anastasopoulou from Greece will show us the challenges of Job Brokering on the background of two completely different labour market situations and how to develop a common understanding of the Job Broker occupation. Christina Knais from Cyprus will highlight the principles of action learning and self-directed learning as basis for learning materials for Job Brokers developed in frame of the Job Broker Project. Eventually the conference presents different practical approaches in the area of Job Brokering.

The conference will be devoted to the following aspects:

- An occupational profile for "Job Brokers" in EU
- "Job Broker" trainings across Europe
- Innovative Job Brokering activities
- Kick-Off for a European Network of Job Brokers
- Networking possibilities in the international community of professional Job Brokers
